
Literally the Rolls Royce of Carousels, this Engilsh Roundabout was built by the Rolls Royce factory in Derby in 1931 for the company's field day.

Designed, built, owned and operated by the Rolls Royce Company for years. An excellent provenace followed as this rare piece has been in a few well known collections.

Each horse, cast in the Rolls Royce factory, has a leather saddle and leather rein. The 12 outside horses are named after famous Rolls Royce cars and aero engines eg' Ghost, Shadow, Merlin, Phantom.

THE ROLLS-ROYCE MERRY-GO-ROUND

The late Harry Fergusson-Wood (1908-1994) joined Rolls-Royce Ltd. in Derby as a Premium Apprentice in May 1926 and progressed through the test department and later in the experimental department. He retired as the head of Jack Barclay Service Depot in Battersea, in 1972. Harry had mentioned to me that Rolls-Royce Derby had made a roundabout for the Company's 'field day' in the 1930s. It was made by the Mill-wrights Department under the superintendent Mr. J. A. Scholes. It is mounted on a 40/50 h.p. 'Phantom' type front axle beam. The 24 horses were cast in the aluminium foundry in the Derby Works. There was a brass plate afixed to the 'chassis' with the inscribed words "The property of Rolls-Royce Ltd."


It was back in September 1978 that I accompanied Harry Fergusson-Wood to Moreton-in-Marsh to locate a travelling fairground proprietor who was said to own this machine. We enquired in a local toy shop & the owner put us in touch with a restorer of fairground equipment in that area. Finally we located the premises where the foot merry-go-round was being restored. A purchase was negotiated and the whole machine was found to be easily dismantled and transported on its own trailer. It was owned by the late Neville Vincent (President of the Bovis Construction Company). We sold it for him to the Indian industrialist Vijay Mallya. I had hoped that Ian Rimmer (recently retired head of the Rolls-Royce Experimental Dept. in Crewe) might have been able to track down a period photo of the merry-go-round in operation at the 1955 and 1960 'field day' events. Alas, the Crewe factory photographic archives have been unable to locate one for us. I live in hope one might still turn up!



BOLT ON INNER FRAME COVERS.



SLOT IN TO PLACE THE ROOMDING BOARDS AND BOLT TOGETHER.




LOCATE CANVAS ROOF OVER CENTRAL PER AND SPREAD OUT OVER FRAMES.






